

### **Pension Application for Henry Vanhining**

R.10871 (Widow: Prudence)

Letter in file dated December 12, 1910, written in response to an inquiry.

In reply to your letter dated the 2<sup>nd</sup> and received the 6<sup>th</sup> instant, you are advised that in the claim of Henry Vanhining, Rej. File No. 10871, Rev. War, it is alleged that he served mostly in New York, as much as eighteen months or two years, in the Militia and in the regular troops of that State, no officers named. He lived "about Saratoga".

He married April 22, 1824, in Medina County, Ohio, Prudence Taylor and died December 25, 1824, in Medina County, Ohio, Prudence Taylor and died December 25, 1840, in Summit County, Ohio.

His widow Prudence applied for pension June 3, 1850, while a resident of Jefferson County, Illinois; her claim was not allowed for lack of proof of service.
