

Pension Application for William Dyckman Vermilyea

R.10933 (Widow: Frances) William died August 18, 1799. Frances died March 28, 1847.

On this 24th day of November one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, personally appeared before me in open court, Mary Haines, who being duly sworn according to law, deposes and says that she is a daughter and [?] heir at law of William Dyckman Vermilyea, and Frances Vermilyea (whose name before marriage, was Frances Bonnet) and that according to the best of her information believes were married by the Rev'd M. Murdock a Minister of the Church of England in the year 1783.

That the said William Dyckman Vermilyea, volunteered and served as a private for some years previously to the end of the Revolutionary War in 1783—and for further particulars of said service, begs leave to refer to the statements filed in this matter by a Mr. Storms, during the life time of Deponent's Mother.

That her father the within mentioned William Dyckman Vermilyea, died on the 18th day of August 1799, at Yonkers in Westchester County, in the State of New York, leaving his widow the said Frances Vermilyea and only three children him surviving viz—Mary, Peter, and Susan—that the said Mary is now this deponent and that Susan is married also and is now Susan Swarts, all of whom are of lawful age and now reside in the State of New York.

That the said Frances, Still continued to be the widow of William Dyckman Vermilyea, until, the time of her Death which took place at the City of New York, on the 28th day of May 1847, aged eighty six years, and further that this deposition is made for the purpose of obtaining the pension, allowed to Revolutionary Soldiers in the virtue of an "Act passed on the seventh day of July 1838"—

Deponent further says that she now resides at No 193, on 42d Street West, and in said City. (Signed) Mary Haines.
