

Pension Application for John Vinet

On this twenty ninth day of May 1819, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the county and state aforesaid: Personally appears John Vinet aged sixty four years, resident in Champlain in the said county and state, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:"

That the said John Vinet enlisted in Albany in the state of New York in the company commanded by Captain Lebere of the Regiment of Colonel Haze in the summer of 1776; that he continued to serve in the said corps; or in the service of the Untied States until the end of the war May or June 1783 when he was discharged from service in New Windsor state of New York; that he was in the battles of Staten Island Brunswick, German town, Brandywine & YorkTown and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need to the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services, at the time of his Discharge [???] commanded the company & his discharge is lost.
