

Pension Application for Matthew Visscher or Visscher

R.10954 (Widow: Lydia)

Albany County SS.

On this 17th day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, personally appeared before the Justices Court of the City of Albany, (the same being Court of Record) Lydia Visscher a resident of the City of Albany, aged eighty three years, who, being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on her oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 4, 1836:--

That she is the widow of Matthew Vischer, who was a Lieutenant and Captain in a Company of New York Militia, in the Regiment belonging to the County of Albany, and commanded by Col. Jacob Lansing Junr and who served as such Lieutenant and captain in the Revolutionary War.

She further declares that she was married to the said Matthew Visscher on the twenty sixth day of October in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy tow:- - that he Husband, the aforesaid Matthew Visscher, died on the eighth day of August in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety three--: and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that her name previous to her said marriage, was Lydia Fryer. (Signed) Lydia Visscher
