

**Pension Application for Abraham Vosburgh**

On this fourteenth day of June Eighteen hundred and forty [forty] two personally appeared before Henry V.M. Martin one of the Justices of the Justices Court of Record in the City of Troy in the County aforesaid. . . Abraham Vosburgh a resident of the County aforesaid who doth on his oath make the following Declaration in in [sic] order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832.

First that in the summer of 1776 I served under and went under Capt John Lantman of the Militia in Col. Bakermay or Beekmary Regt from Albany now Rensselaer Co. aforesaid went north to Saratoga Stillwater and in the spring we abandoned Ticonderoga as the British got possession of Mount Independence and came to Fort Ann at this time I was gone not less than six months, General Schuyler had the command. L Again this deponent testifies that in the above tour he was drafted, that his own Col. before mentioned did not go and he cannot bring to his Col he served under only that Schuyler had the command.

Further that in the summer of 1777 he stood a draught in Michael Lantmary Company in the same Regt before mentioned and that George and John Record were draughted [sic] and that as they did not to go. That this deponent and Cousin Peter Lanpman volunteered and went in their place for three months under Capt. Michael Lampman in both their Col. Regt aforesaid.

That they went to Albany then to the North to Stillwater Fort and other places until our times were out.

He hereby relinquishes every claim to a pension or annuity of a pension except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension role [roll] of any State.

Further that he appoints William C. Follet his lawful attorney in the above application.

That he knows of no person living that was knowing to his services nor of any documentary evidence. (Signed with his mark) Abraham Vosburgh
