W.10388 (Former Widow: Margaret (Finks) Balcom) Margaret and Edward married December 5, 1837, he died December 2, 1842. She then married Austin Balcom who died December 20, 1863.

On this the 13th day of June 1820 personally appeared in open court being a court of Record for the aforesaid county and solemnly adjudge to be such by the [?] of the several States, Edward Walker aged sixty one years resident in Coventry in said County Edward Walker aged sixty one years resident in Coventry in said county who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows.

In the New York line in Colonels Livingston's Regiment & & last on Col. Cortland's Regiment in Capt Fowlers Company of Infantry. My original declaration was dated on the 22d day of April 1818 and the number of my pension certificate is B.348.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18th March 1818 and I have not nor has any person in trust for me my property or securities, contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed.
