

Pension Application for Samuel Walker

Supreme Court November Term A.D. 1820.

On this eleventh day of November A.D. 1820, personally appeared in open court (being a court of record) for the said county Samuel Walker aged sixty years resident in said county of Muskingum, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows:

He enlisted as a private soldier in said war on the continental establishment in the month of May 1779 in Albany in the fifth New York regiment Capt. Bowers company in the New York line, and under Col. Lewis Dubois; was with General Sullivan in his engagement with the Indians, was also at the taking of Cornwallis in Capt. Henry Vandebarrick's company in which this deponent remained till he was discharged which was in June 1783, at Snakehill in the State of New York making upwards of four years all together.

The date of his original declaration is 2nd day of August A.D. 1819, he has received a pension certificate the number of which is 14,506 and its date 22nd September 1819.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818, And that I have not since that time ;by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled, "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war", passed on the 18th day of March 1818;--And that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed.

This declarant further states, he is a farmer but very unable to pursue it, having once had his thigh broken, having now the rheumatism severely and having been wounded in the knee in the last war between England and America at Fort Erie, has a wife, no children; she is also much afflicted with the Rheumatism and this declarant needs for his support the aid of public or private Charity. (Signed with his mark) Samuel Walker.
