

**Pension Application for Frederick Wamire or Wemire**

On this eighteenth day of April 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for Orange County in the State of New York personally appeared Frederick Wamire aged seventy nine years resident in the town of Montgomery county of orange and State of New York who being by me first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled “an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War”, that he the said Frederick Warire enlisted in the Newyork [New York] line at Fishkill in the County of Dutchess in the State of Newyork in the company commanded by Captain Godwin of the light infantry in Col Dubois Regiment.

That he continued to serve in the said corps or in the service of the United States from the summer of the year 1776 until the year 1783 when he was honorably discharged at New Windsor in the State of New York that he was in the battles of York town at the surrender of Lord Cornwallis and at the taking of Fort Montgomery by the British and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services—except the affidavit of Abraham Delancey hereunto annexed.
