

### **Disability for Gideon Waring**

N.Y. Agency. Dis—no papers

Letter in folder dated May 4, 1927, written in response to an inquiry.

In response to your letter of the 2<sup>nd</sup> instant, with the enclosed letters of Mrs. Adella W. Beach, Box 371, Oakville, Connecticut, I have the honor to advise you that from the records of this Bureau it appears that Gideon Waring was a Captain in the War of the Revolution, and was pensioned at the rate of \$120 per annum, at the New York agency.

He died April 4, 1802.

There is no further data on file as to his services and no data on file as to his family, owing to the destruction of papers in such claims when the War Office was burned in 1800 and in 1814.

The Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to any Gideon Warren.

A sole page lends additions data on Gideon Waring.

From the records of this Bureau, it appears that Gideon Waring was a captain in the War of the Revolution, and was pensioned at the rate of \$120 per annum, at the New York Agency.

He died April 4, 1802.

There is no further data on file as to his services and no data on file as to his family, owing to the destruction of papers in such claims when the War Office was burned in 1800 and in 1814.
