

Pension Application for Jonathan Weed

W.22581 (Widow: Hannah) Married July 1, 1786. Jonathan died January 16, 1809.
State of New York
Livingston County SS.

On this ninth day of May 1839 personally appeared before the court of Oyre & Terminer of the County of Livingston in open Court Hannah weed a resident of the town of Mount Morris in the County of Livingston & State of New York aged seventy five years nearly who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 entitled "An act granting half pay & pensions to certain widows":

That she is the widow of Jonathan Weed who as a private in the Regiment commanded by Lt Colonel Marinus Willett of New York State troops or Levies & served in the company of Captain Sackett:

That the period for which he served in said regiment was more than three years and for nine months under said Captain Sackett:

That the said Jonathan Weed never received a pension in consideration of his services in the said War & never applied for a pension—that she does not know how he was called into service—nor does she know the names & rank of the field officers under whom he served or when he left the service or any other particulars of his service.

She further declares that she was married to the said Jonathan Weed on or about the first day of July in the year seventeen hundred and eighty six that her husband the aforesaid Jonathan Weed died on the 16th day of January 1809:

That she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January seventeen hundred & ninety four viz at the time above stated and that she has not since been married. (Signed) Hannah Weed

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed the Seal of said Court & County this Ninth day of May AD 1839. W. H. Stanley
