

## **Pension Application for Gilbert Weeks**

### Revolutionary Claims

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of an act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldier of the Army of the Revolution" approved on the 15<sup>th</sup> May 1828.

I Gilbert Weeks of the Town of Peekskill in the County of WestChester in the State of New York do hereby declare that I as a soldier in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution and served as such to the end of the War at which period I was a soldier in Captain Wisenfels Company in the Regiment commanded by Col Philip Van Courtlandt commonly called the 2d New York Regiment of Infantry in which Regiment I served, from March 1777.

Witness my hand this 24<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord 1828. (Signed)

Effingham Shefflin one of the Judges of the Marine Court of the City and County of new York in the State of New York personally appeared this day John Anderson and General Daniel Delavan both of the City County and State aforesaid who did severally make oath that Gilbert weeks by whom the foregoing declaration was subscribed is generally reputed and believed to have been a soldier in the Army of the Revolution in manner as therein stated.
