

**Pension Application for Frederick Weissenfels**

B.L.Wt.2361-500; Lt. Col. Commandant Issued Jan 29, 1790. No papers.  
Letter in folder dated August 17, 1932, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to the burial place of your ancestor, Colonel Frederick E. Baron De Weissenfels, who served with distinction in the Revolutionary War.

It is regretted that this office is unable to furnish the information you seek.

The Revolutionary War records of this office show in regard to this officer, only that Bounty Land Warrant No. 2361, for five hundred acres of bounty land, was issued January 29, 1790, on account of his service as Lieutenant Colonel Commandant in the New York line in the Revolutionary War.

There are no statements on file which were made by the applicant for this bounty land warrant because of the destruction of papers in such early applications, when the War Office was burned in 1800, hence, no information in regard to his family, details of his service, birth, or death, residences, etc.
