

Pension Application for Uriah White

Be it remembered that on the 18th day of June 1820 before me Abijah H. Beach one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in & for Otsego County personally appeared Uriah White Resident of the Town of Milford in the said County of Otsego who being duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare & say that he the said Uriah White served the United States in the Revolutionary War as a private soldier in the company commanded by Peter VnRensselaer in the Regiment commanded by Colo James Livingston in the service of the State of New York on the Continental Establishment.

That he made application for a pension on the sixteenth day of April 1818th that he received a Certificate of Pension dated the 21st day of July 1819 and No 13231 from the war Department of the United States and the said Uriah White doth further says under his oath as aforesaid that he is now sixty years and two months old that he is a widower and has no family except his daughter Lydia 14 years old.

That he is much afflicted with the Gravell ;and other Bodily Infirmities he is unable to perform his daily Laborer.

And further the said Uriah White did thereupon take and subscribe before me the said Abijah H. Beach on oath in the words following viz. I, Uriah White do Solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any other manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with until so to the same it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress Entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed the 18th March 1818 and that I have not nor has any persons in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to ;me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. (Signed) Uriah White

Sworn to & subscribed the 18th day of June 1829 before me Abijah H. Beach one of the Judges aforesaid.

A Schedule containing the whole estate Real ;and personal and all the income of Uriah White. Necessary clothing & bedding excepted taken & subscribed by the said Uriah White before me the said Abijah H. Beach one of the Judges as aforesaid on the 13th day of June 1820.

One note of hand of 60 dollars agst Richard Miller dated Sept 1816 not good not collatectable.

One note of 18 dolls against Wm White dated Octobe 1813 not good.

One note of 20 dollars agst Zach Ward given 5 years agao

One note agst Peter White for 100 bushesl of Rye payable in two years by Instalments this last note is considered good and was obtained with former pension money. -50—
