

**Pension Application for Frederick Wibert**

On this seventeenth day of ;July in the year 1818 before me James Thompson first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in & for the County of Saratoga and State of Ne York, personally appeared, Frederick Wibert, aged fifty nine years, resident in the Town of Greenfield in the County of Saratoga aforesaid, being of the people called Friends of Quakers, who being by me first duly affirmed according to law, doth on his affirmation make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War"—

That the said Frederick Wibert enlisted in the service of his country to serve during the war, at Fishkill landing in the summer of 1777 under Capt Teabout in the third Regiment in the New York line of Continental troops commanded by Col. Gansevoort but his company was shortly after commanded by Capt. Sites or Sithers. That he served faithfully as a soldier until the close of the war, & until honorably discharged near Newburgh in the State of New York & after having served upwards of six years; that he was in the battle at the taking of Cornwallis at York in Virginia, and in come skirmishes at Fort Stanwix in the State of New York.

That after receiving his discharge he sold the same and his right his land, but never received anything of consequence for the same but is therefore unable to procure his said discharge.

That he is infirm & unable to labor sufficiently for his maintenance, and is now in reduced circumstances & absolutely stands in need of the assistance of his country for support. (Signed with his mark) Frederick Wibert
