

Pension Application for Henry Williams

Henry Williams from the State of New York, now resident in the Town of Colchester, New London County State of Connecticut—a resident Citizen of the United States—declares and testifies on oath, that he enlisted at Albany State of New York in the year 1777 into the army of the Unites States in the War of the Revolution for four years and joined Captain Wendell's Company 6th New York Regiment commanded by Coll Van Schaick upon the Continental Establishment went to Ticonderoga returned to Lake George—was in the action at the capture of Genl Burgoyne at Saratoga in October in s'd year—was afterwards stationed between Albany & Ticonderoga till his time of service expired—was discharged at Albany by Major Hall at the expiration of his four years service, and has lost his discharge, that he is now poor and needy, being sixty years of age.

That he is by reason of his reduced circumstance in life in need of assistance from his country for his support.

That he hereby relinquishes all claim to any pension excepting by [?] of an act of Congress entitled an act to prescribe for certain persons engaged in Land or naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war to substantiate his claim under said act he makes this declaration. Dated this 21st day of March AD 1818. (Signed with his mark) Henry Williams
