

Pension Application for Isaac Wiltsie

On this 8th day of May 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the court of common pleas in and for the County of Schoharie personally appears Isaac Wiltsie aged sixty one years resident in Middleburgh in the said County who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war."

That the said Isaac Wiltsie enlisted as a private in the Continental service in the State of New York, he thinks sometime in January 1778 for during the war in the company commanded by a Captain Newkirk of the 2nd Regiment of the New York Troops Commanded by Colonel Courtlandt, that he continued to serve in the same croops [corps] or in the service of the United States untill the seventh day of June 1783 when he was honorably discharged from service in a place called little Brittian in theState of New York, that he was in the Battle of Saratoga at the taking of Burgoyne, and at the taking of Cornwallis at Yorktown and at the battle at White Plains and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance rfo his country for support. That he has no other than the accompanying evidence now in his power of his said services. And that he relinquishes all other claims upon the Government that existed prior to the passing of the aforesaid act of Congress. (Signed with his mark) Isaac Wiltsie
