

Pension Application for John Winna

W.19637 (Widow: Anna) Married fall 1791, John died February 1811.

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of the 7th July 1838, Entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows"—

County of Ulster SS.

On this twenty sixth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty one personally appeared before me Samuel Stilwell, one of the Judges of the court of Common Pleas in and for said County of Ulster being a Court of record, Anna Winna a resident of the town of Marbletown, in the County of Ulster and State of New York aged seventy nine years, who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 Entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows—That she is the widow of John Winne, who was a private in the militia of the State of New York in the Revolutionary War—Said Deponent has frequently heard her husband the said John Winna tell of his service in the Revolution and remembers well of having him; tell of having served under one Livingston eight months—also eight months under Capt Hunter when he went to join Sullivan's Army, that the army had moved from the Susquehannah arrived there, that they then returned and went to Stony Point, where said Winna served out said term of eight months—also that he had served about four months under Capt. Henry Pawling on the frontiers at Shandaken—and two months and or Capt Frederick Schoonmaker at Fort Montgomery—said Deponent cannot tell the dates of said services—and has heard him say that he had served on Scouts and alarms along the frontiers besides—

She further declares that she was married to the said John Winna in the fall of the year seventeen hundred and ninety one, that her husband, the aforesaid John Winna died in the month of February one thousand eight hundred and Eleven. That she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place, previous to the first of January Seventeen hundred and ninety four, viz at the time above stated.
