

Pension Application for Kallion Wine or Kallione Winne or Killiam Winnee

W.2039 (Widow: Rachel)

On this seventh day of October 1827 personally appeared in the Court of Common Pleas of the County of Delaware, in the State of New York at an open Court then held at the court house in the said County the same being a Court of Record proceeding according to the course of the Common Law—Kallion Wine, aged Seventy eight years—resident in the said County—who being first duly sworn according to Law—doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the Acts of Congress of the 18th March 1818 and the first May 1820—

That he enlisted in the month of March 1776, for the term of nine months in the Town of Coxsackie then County of Albany now County of Greene in a Company of Foot commanded by Capt Robert Edmunston and in the Regiment commanded by Col. Goosen Van Schaick in the line of the State of New York on the Continental Establishment.

That he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a Pension except he present—

That his name is not on the Roll of any state except the State of Nw York—

And that the following are the reasons for not making earlier application for a Pension—

That by his Inventory in his Occupation of a Shoemaker he has hitherto made out a living for himself & family but through age and infirmity his Capacity has failed.

That on the seventh day of February 1827 he made his declaration in the Court of Common Pleas of the county of Delaware aforesaid in open Court in order to obtain the provision made by the Acts of Congress aforesaid, as will appear by the annexed documents and the same referred back from the Department of War—for amendment and further proof.

And in pursuance of the Act of the 1st May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled “An act of provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18 day of March 1818 – and that I have not –nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me—nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

Schedule

Real Estate-I have none nor had I any on the 18 March 1818 nor have I had any since the 18th March aforesaid.

Personal Estate—one cow, three sheep, three swine, one Sett [set] of shoe makers Tools—one Table, five Kettles—one spider, one set of knives and forks—a small quantity of Crockery ware, two exes, and some articles of household furniture of small value (my necessary clothing & bedding excepted) And I do further swear that the foregoing Schedule contains all the property I was possessed of on the 18 day of March 1818 or at any time since—and no changes have been made in the same except one sheep has died and I have one Lamb instead thereof—

And I do further swear that I am by occupation a Shoemaker and my family consists of myself and Wife who is also aged and infirm—one child aged about 13 years and have no other means to support myself and family except by my said Occupation. (Signed with his mark) Kalline Winne
