

Bounty Land for Paul Worden

B.L.Wt.992100 (Widow: Sarah)

Letter in folder dated April 11, 1914, written in response to an inquiry.

In response to your letter dated the 2nd instant, you are advised that bounty land Warrant No. 992 for 200 acres was allowed on account of the services of Paul Worden, a Private in the Corps of Artillery Artificers during the Revolution. He died June 4, 1809.

In 1819, his widow Sarah was a resident of Fayette, Seneca County, New York, and their children were: May wife of John Newkirk; Else wife of John Clark; Richard; Abiah wife of Samuel Worden; Mercy wife of John Campbell; Margaret wife of Francis Brown.

In 1856, Sarah Avenoy daughter of May Newkirk was a resident of New Haven, Huron County, Ohio.

There is no further data relative to soldier's service of family on file.
