

## Pension Application for David Weed

On this second day of June 1820 personally appeared in open court being a court of Record for the said County of Orange in the state of New York David Weed aged Fifty nine years and eleven months. Resident in the county and State aforesaid who being duly sworn, according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as Follows he enlisted in the month of March 1777 in the company commanded by Capt Abraham Swartout in third New York Regiment Commanded by Colonel Peter Gansvoort and served in the said Regiment Three years and was discharged at MorrisTown in the state of New Jersey, and the date of the original Declaration has date on the eighth day of April One thousand eight hundred and eighteen his Pension Certificate is No. 3041.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my Property or any part thereof with Intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any Property or Securities Contracts or debts due to me nor have I any Income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me Subscribed.
