Born in 1745
Died September 12, 1831; age 86 years
Hannah; his wife
Born in 1744
Died May 1, 1828; age 84 years
Buried in the Maple Avenue Cemetery; Fultonville; Town of Glen;
Montgomery County; New York.

SERVICE

Appointed First Lieutenant in 1776 in Captain Robert Abraham Yates' Company (Third Company) in Colonel Frederick Visscher's Regiment of Tryon County Militia (Third Regiment) and he was commissioned on June 25, 1778.

Fought at the Battle of Oriskany on August 6, 1777. Wounded in the left thigh and taken prisoner on October 24, 1781.

Appointed Captain of the Fifth Company in Lieutenant Colonel John Newkirk's Regiment of Montgomery County Militia in Brigadier General Frederick Vischer's Brigade on October 2, 1786.

Succeeded as Captain by Peter Yates on March 26, 1787.

WILLIAM PRINTOP

Born April 17, 1766

Died April 11, 1842

Ann; his wife

Born April 16, 1774

Died October 11, 1841

Buried in the Printop Family Plot; Fultonville; Montgomery County; New York.

SERVICE

Served as a private in Captain Robert Abraham Yates' Company (Third Company) in Colonel Frederick Visscher's Regiment of Tryon County Militia (Third Regiment).

PETER ABRAHAM YATES

Born in 1752

Died March 17, 1824

Catherine Dockstader; his wife

Born in 1762

Died June 4, 1831

Buried in Randall; Montgomery County; New York.

SERVICE

Appointed Second Lieutenant on August 26, 1775 in Captain Robert Abraham Yates' (His brother) Company (Third Company) in Colonel Frederick Visscher's Regiment of Tryon County Militia (Third Regiment).

Appointed Lieutenant in Captain Joseph Printop's Company (Fifth Company) in Lieutenant Colonel John Newkirk's Regiment of Montgomery County Militia in Brigadier General Frederick Visscher's Brigade on October 2, 1786.

Promoted Captain vice Joseph Printop of the Fifth Company in Lieutenant Colonel John Newkirk's Regiment of Montgomery County Militia in Brigadier General Frederick Visscher's Brigade on March 26, 1787.

Resigned on April 6, 1799.

ROBERT ABRAHAM YATES

Born in 1749

Died June 12, 1821

Dirike Gardinier; his wife

Born in 1752

Died October 17, 1828

Buried in Randall; Montgomery County; New York.

SERVICE

Appointed Captain on August 26, 1775 of the Third Company in Colonel Frederick Visscher's Regiment of Tryon County Militia (Third Regiment).

Fought at the Battle of Oriskany on August 6, 1777

Appointed First Major in Lieutenant Colonel John Newkirk's Regiment of Montgomery County Militia in Brigadier General Frederick Visscher's Brigade on October 2, 1786.

Appointed Lieutenant Colonel vice John Newkirk on October 8, 1793 in Brigadier General Volkert Veeder's Brigade.

Resigned on March 25, 1797.
