

Pension Application for John Frederick Yengling

W.11610 (Widow: Margaret) Married April 5, 1773. John Frederick Yengling died June 22, 1836.

State of Pennsylvania

Columbia County SS

On the second day of October 1818 before me the subscriber one of the associate Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of Columbia County in said State personally appeared John F. Yengling aged sixty six years resident in the Columbia County aforesaid who being by me duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war."

That he the said John F. Yengling enlisted in Albany in the State of New York in the year 1778 in the Company commanded by Captain Austin of the first New York Regiment commanded by Colonel Gansevoortt and continued in the service of the United States until the 8th of June 1782 and was disparaged at Basebrook in the State of New Jersey by General Washington as for his discharge sent herewith more fully appears, that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support, and that he never received any pension heretofore from the State or United States.
